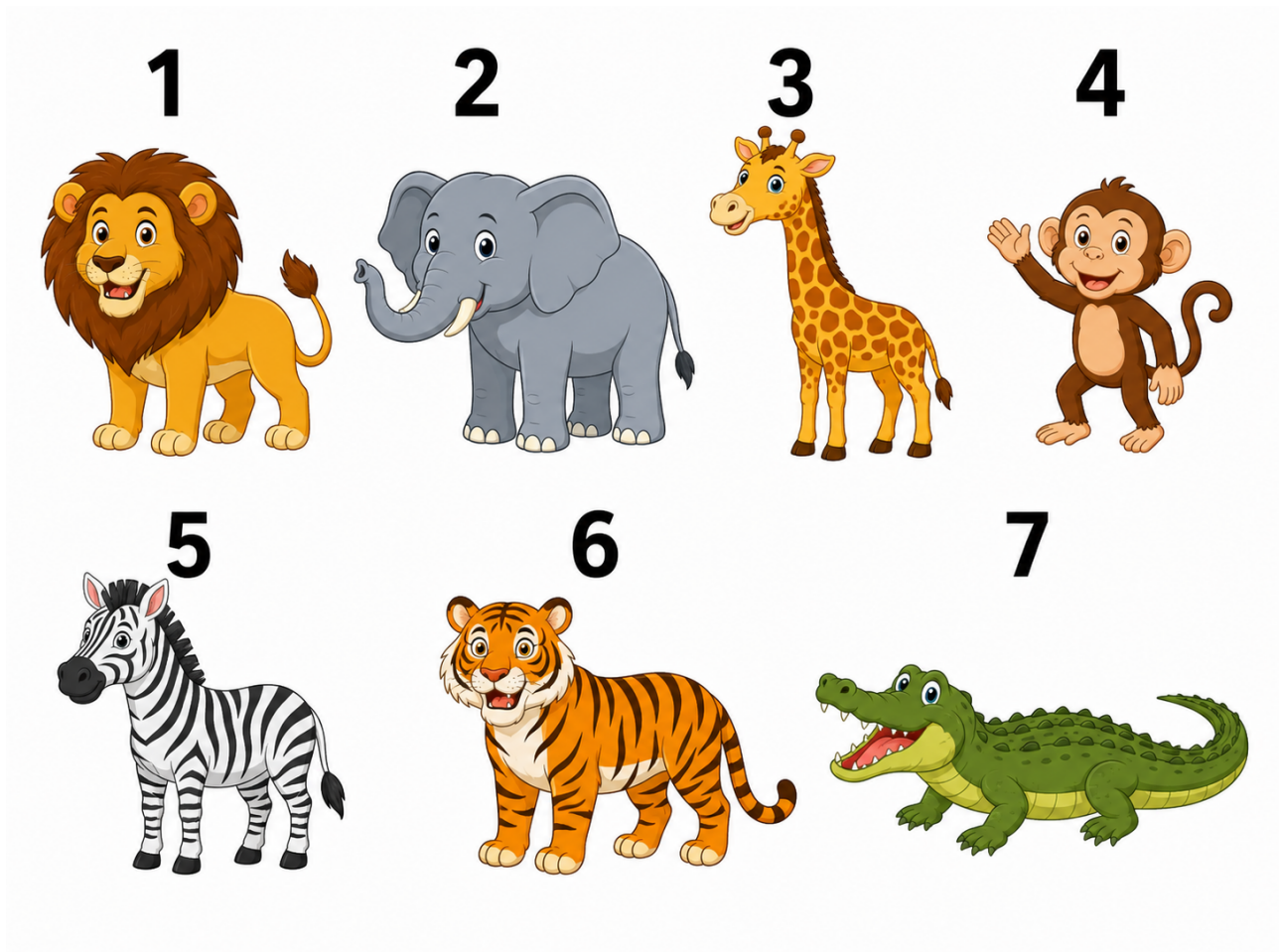

In this guide you will learn the names of wild animals and farm animals in English. (En esta guía aprenderás los nombres de los animales salvajes y de granja en inglés.)

Wild Animals

Wild animals live in nature. They live in forests, jungles, and deserts. People do not keep them at home. Look at the picture below to see some wild animals.



Here are the wild animals in the picture:

- Number 1 is a lion.
- Number 2 is an elephant.
- Number 3 is a giraffe.

- Number 4 is a monkey.
- Number 5 is a zebra.
- Number 6 is a tiger.
- Number 7 is a crocodile.

Ejemplo 1

You see a big, striped cat in the jungle. What animal is it?

Step 1: Think about the animal. It is big. It has stripes. It lives in the jungle.

Step 2: Look at the word list. The animal with stripes is a tiger.

Answer: It is a tiger.

Ejemplo 2

You want to say "I see an elephant." Is it correct to say "a elephant" or "an elephant"?

Step 1: The word "elephant" starts with the vowel "e".

Step 2: Before a vowel, we use "an", not "a".

Answer: We say "an elephant." We also say "an ant" and "an orange."

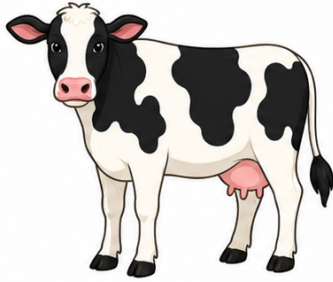
Recuerda: Wild animals live in nature. Use "an" before animal names that start with a vowel: an elephant, an owl, an iguana.

Farm Animals

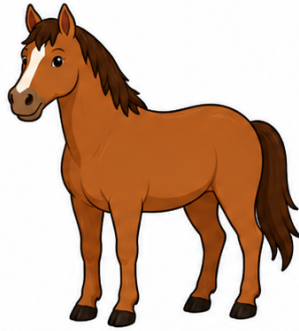
Farm animals live on a farm. Farmers take care of them. They give us food like milk, eggs, and meat.

Look at the picture below to see some farm animals.

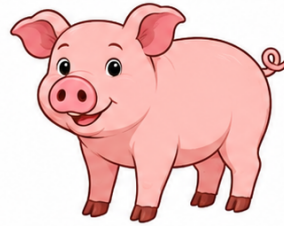
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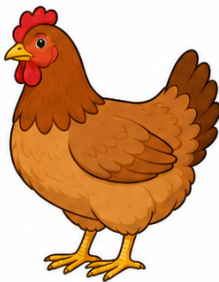
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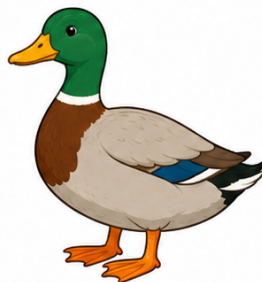
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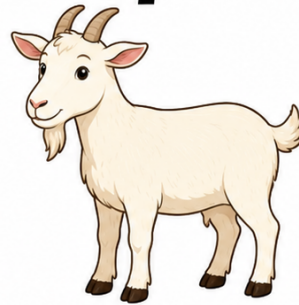
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Here are the farm animals in the picture:

- Number 1 is a cow.
- Number 2 is a horse.
- Number 3 is a pig.
- Number 4 is a sheep.
- Number 5 is a hen.
- Number 6 is a duck.
- Number 7 is a goat.

Ejemplo 1

Maria is on a farm. She sees an animal that gives milk. What animal is it?

Step 1: Think about farm animals that give milk.

Step 2: The animal that gives milk is a cow.

Answer: It is a cow.

Ejemplo 2

How do we make the plural of farm animals? Let's practice with "pig" and "hen."

Step 1: Add -s to make a plural in English.

Step 2: pig + s = pigs. hen + s = hens.

Answer: One pig, two pigs. One hen, three hens.

Recuerda: Farm animals live on a farm. To talk about more than one animal, add -s: cows, horses, pigs, hens.

Wild or Farm? How to Classify Animals

Sometimes you need to decide if an animal is wild or from a farm. Ask yourself two questions:

Does it live in nature, like a jungle or forest? Then it is a wild animal.

Does it live on a farm with a farmer? Then it is a farm animal.

Ejemplo 1

Is a giraffe a wild animal or a farm animal?

Step 1: Think about where a giraffe lives.

Step 2: A giraffe lives in the jungle or savanna. It does not live on a farm.

Answer: A giraffe is a wild animal.

Ejemplo 2

Is a duck a wild animal or a farm animal?

Step 1: A duck can live near water in nature, but it can also live on a farm.

Step 2: In our picture, the duck is a farm animal.

Answer: A duck is a farm animal.

Recuerda: Ask "Where does it live?" to classify an animal. If it lives in nature, it is wild. If it lives on a farm, it is a farm animal.

Animal Names: Singular and Plural

In English, we add -s to a noun to make it plural. This works for animal names too.

One lion, two lions. One monkey, three monkeys. One sheep, two sheep. (The word "sheep" does not change in the plural. It is a special word!)

Ejemplo 1

Write the plural of these animals:

Step 1: cow + s = cows.

Step 2: tiger + s = tigers.

Step 3: horse + s = horses.

Answer: cows, tigers, horses.

Ejemplo 2

A student writes: "There are two sheeps on the farm." Is this correct?

Step 1: The word "sheep" is a special plural. It does not change.

Step 2: We do not write "sheeps."

Answer: The correct sentence is: "There are two sheep on the farm."

Recuerda: Most animals just add -s: lions, giraffes, pigs. But "sheep" stays the same: one sheep, two sheep.

Resumen

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- Wild animals live in nature: lion, elephant, giraffe, monkey, zebra, tiger, crocodile.
 - Farm animals live on a farm: cow, horse, pig, sheep, hen, duck, goat.
 - Use "a" before consonants: a lion, a cow, a pig.
 - Use "an" before vowels: an elephant, an owl.
 - To make a plural, add -s: cows, lions, monkeys.
 - "Sheep" is special: one sheep, two sheep (no -s).
